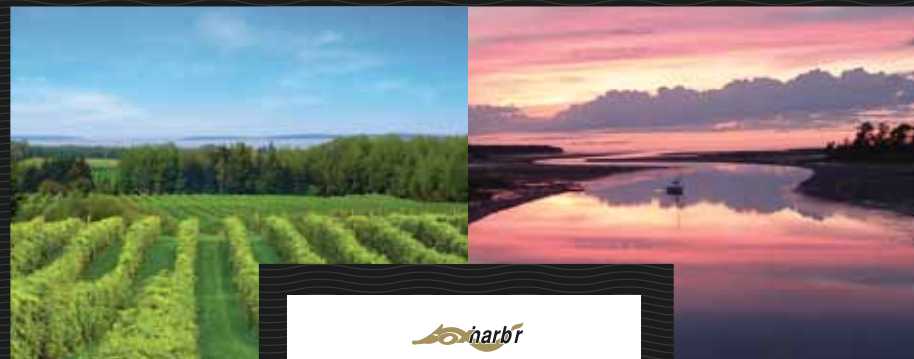

TATAMAGOUCHE

30 min/ 30 km from resort

Full of character, this thriving riverside village derives its name from the native Mi'kmaq term Takumegoochk, roughly translated as "extending across," given its location on the Waugh River, flowing into the Atlantic Ocean.

Centred around the **Tatamagouche Creamery**, which produced butter from 1925 to 1992, this charming multi-faceted waterfront attraction includes the Heritage Centre (290 million year old fossils, butter, giantess Anna Swan, and a new Acadian & Mi'kmaq exhibit opening June 16), a **Saturday Farmers' Market**, a traditional **Boat Building Shop**, and the **Grace Jollymore Arts Centre** and its Ice House Gallery.
